Tobacco Flavor Ban Presentation	Derek gave a brief overview of why we regulate flavored tobacco - see slides for more detail     Tobacco is the #1 preventable cause of early death     Racist targeting of Black, Hispanic/Latinx and Native Americans for decades     Tobacco industry was sued in the 90s, revealing previously classified information such as the Kool quote that they are deliberately targeting Black and Hispanic communities      Pernicious targeting of African American community     Important not to blame communities for their smoking patterns - forced on the community      History repeats itself - vaping has been called a youth epidemic     Juul pitched e-cigs to Native American tribes as a health solution     Tribes rejected them     Juul went into high school classrooms and did child market testing     Called products totally safe     Moms took on the fight      Products are clearly designed for children (e.g. Bubble Gang product)     Flavored cigarettes were outlawed, except for menthol     All the other flavored products that are hard to decipher from candy popped up	Derek Smith, Kari McFarlan
