


Timeline and Upcoming Deadlines

Facility Readiness & Insurance

Documentation meeting requirements need to be submitted by February 15th 2024

All new PFA providers will need to meet facility and insurance requirements in order to move forward with your Preschool for All contract.

Subcontracted through Micro Enterprise Services of Oregon (MESO):

- Home-based family child care providers
- Single-site centers licensed for under 100 children
- Supports small business owners (home-based, small centers)



Funding



- Start-Up funds
- Slot Allocation Funds
- Transportation Funds
- Inclusion Funds
 - For providers who request and are approved
- Infant/Toddler Stabilization
