Safe Routes to School (SRTS) programs aim to create **healthy**, **convenient**, and **fun** opportunities for students to **walk** and **roll to** and from school.







Pedestrian Safety Lessons

Since March 2021:

- 10,000+ students taught in 476 lessons
- PE lessons: A,B,C schedule = 3 days to teach all students
- Summer schools all Districts

Ongoing work with Districts to teach the curriculum, known as "Train the Trainer."






