What Does Aid and Assist, Clinical Services Specialist (CSS) Do? Our Clinical Service Specialists (CSS) work with individuals involved in the criminal justice system who have been found unable to aid and assist in their criminal defense. When individuals have been found unable to aid and assist they are sometimes ordered to the Oregon State Hospital for treatment and sometimes they remain in jail. Our team works to see clients in both settings to determine the appropriate level of care and also to determine if individuals are appropriate for community restoration. When clients are appropriate for community restoration, our team sends out referrals to several types of treatment facilities that include; residential facilities, supportive housing, crisis hotels, and shelters. Our CSS's are then assigned to meets clients to ensure that they are compliant with court





requirements while they are under community restoration while they remain unable to aid and assist.

Internship Description & Responsibilities:

- Assist in community education for legal skills and resource development for the needs of individual clients and group setting consultations
- Assist in maintaining a caseload of 5 to 10 clients
- Assist with identifying resources for housing placements and facilities including community, long-term care and acute care.
- Being present in court and speaking about clients assigned to their caseload.
- Attend care coordination meetings for clients.

- Solid understanding of how to teach legal skills
- Understanding of courtroom procedures
