## Prescott Elementary

Lead Agency: Self-Enhancement, Inc.

### Service Area & Target Groups/Focus

Children, adults and families who are homeless, living in poverty and/or at risk of academic failure – primarily from school neighborhood, but services are open to anyone.

School Population: 373 students; Grades K-5; 100% Eligible for Free Meals;  
66% Students of Color (African American 15%, American Indian/AK Native <1%, Asian 13%, Hispanic 25%, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander 2%, Multiple Race 10%, White 34%)

## Evaluation 2013-14

### Outputs

#### **207 youth served**

86% students of color

65% identified as being "at risk of academic failure"

88% qualified for free and reduced lunch

#### **86 adults served**

**144 people served** in non-enrollment events  
(family educational nights, cultural fairs, etc.)

### Outcomes

**78%** of students increased benchmark scores in Reading

**51%** of students increased benchmark scores in Math

**Average daily attendance** of SUN CS students was **94%**

According to teachers, of students who regularly attended SUN CS:

**40%** improved **classroom academic performance**

**60%** improved getting **homework** in on time

**60%** **participated** in class more

**30%** improved **behavior**

**40%** came to school more **motivated to learn**

## SUN Spot: SUN in Action

Prescott SUN is in its 3<sup>rd</sup> year of existence. One of the major barriers for parents at the beginning of the year, was not being able to drop off students early due to having to work, transportation issues, etc. Prescott's principal & Prescott SUN developed "SUN Rise," which is a before school program that allows parents to drop their kids off early. Students are offered homework & reading assistance during the hour of programming. This has been a relief for parents, who have needed the additional resource that SUN Rise provides.
