Lynch Wood Elementary School

Lead Agency: Metropolitan Family Service

Service Area & Target Groups/Focus

Children, adults and families who are homeless, living in poverty and/or at risk of academic failure – primarily from school neighborhood, but services are open to anyone.

School Population: 519 students; Grades K-5; 100% Eligible for Free Meals; 57% Students of Color (African American 14%, Asian 12%, American Indian/AK Native 2%, Hispanic 26%, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander 3%, Multiple Race <1%, White 43%)

Outputs

258 youth served

67% students of color

64% identified as being "at risk of academic failure"

84% qualified for free and reduced lunch

37 adults served

2657 people served in non-enrollment events

(family educational nights, cultural fairs, etc.)

Outcomes

81% of students increased benchmark scores in Reading

69% of students increased benchmark scores in Math

Average daily attendance of SUN CS students was 94%

According to teachers, of students who regularly attended SUN CS:

73% improved classroom academic performance

69% improved getting **homework** in on time

72% participated in class more

61% improved **behavior**

61% came to school more motivated to learn
