

- Supports similar vision with what we heard from Community Leaders and BIPOC community - but there are few key differences




Race and Ethnicity


Virtual Open House survey participants are majority white. Previous survey participants are more reflective of Rockwood area.

Race and Ethnicity in Comparison





Age Distribution in Comparison













Highest priorities among most surveys:


- Recreational areas for sports and play


We build soccer fields like crazy, but we lack in good softball and baseball fields for the groups of kids who don't play [soccer].


ANIMAL SERVICES:


