### Kindergarten COUNTS

Kindergarten Counts brings together early childhood and school partners to promote successful kindergarten transitions in SUN Community Schools for children and their families through supporting:

- Early kindergarten registrations to ensure families are connected to their school and receive the support and information they need.
- Summer opportunities to engage parents and promote social and emotional school readiness skills and summer learning for children.
- Good attendance in kindergarten through data informed early outreach, parent engagement, and attendance incentives.

## Mind in the Making

Multnomah Mind in the Making uses the Seven Essential Skills modules as a focal point for building bridges between early childhood systems and SUN Community Schools. These modules are part of Mind in the Making, a learning campaign led by Ellen Galinsky of the Families and Work Institute to disseminate information about the science of how young children learn best.
