Statistics on premature births can be scary, particularly when you or a loved one is pregnant! However, there are many things you can do to improve your chances of having a healthy, full-term baby.

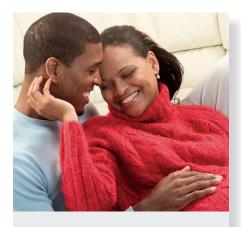
To start, you should know that the following health conditions and lifestyle behaviors can increase the chances for preterm labor:

- You are pregnant with multiple babies.
- You've delivered a premature baby in the past.
- You've had problems with your cervix or uterus.
- You have a history of high blood pressure.
- You have diabetes before your pregnancy, or as a result ofincreased glucose levels during pregnancy.
- You are overweight or underweight.
- You smoke, drink alcohol and/or take illegal drugs.

You should also be aware of the following signs of preterm labor:

- You begin to have contractions every 10 minutes.
- You notice a change in the color of vaginal discharge.
- You feel pelvic pressure, a low dull backache or cramps.

If you experience any of the above, you should call your doctor immediately.



Bits about babies

- In the United States, one in eight babies is born prematurely.¹
- In nearly 40 percent of premature births, the cause is unknown.²
- Babies who are born premature are at higher risk of dying or needing hospitalization and having long-term health problems than babies who are born full-term.³
