#### ★ Portland Winter Light Festival 2022 - All ages

- February 4-12, 2022. This event has been happening for a few years by
   <u>Willamette Light Brigade</u>. It lights up the Central Eastside and near OMSI
   and Tilikum Crossing Bridge with light lights, fire, technology, music. So
   fun! But <u>be warned, it gets super crowded</u>.
- ★ The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). This longer-term program was created by Congress in the Infrastructure and Jobs Act, and replaces the Emergency Broadband Benefit program. Enrollment in the ACP is now open for households with at least one member qualifying under any of the following criteria:
  - Income at or below 200% of the federal poverty quidelines;
  - Participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid,
     Federal Public Housing Assistance, SSI, WIC, or <u>Lifeline</u>;
  - Participates in Tribal specific programs, such as Bureau of Indian Affairs
     General Assistance, Tribal TANF, or Food Distribution Program on Indian
     Reservations;
  - Is approved for benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision;
  - Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year; or
