This is not specific for IDD folks, but any person with a permanent disability. U.S. citizens or permanent residents of the United States that have been medically determined to

have a permanent disability (does not have to be a 100% disability) *may get* a free, lifetime pass that provides admittance to more than 2,000 recreation sites managed by five Federal agencies. See website link for required documentation.
