


Applying an Equity Lens

- Expansion of funding and educational opportunities for youth in detention.




Organizational Chart

Success and Future Plans

- \$100 million for behavioral health housing.
- <u>SB 1522</u> allows funding for juvenile justice centers to be used for transition services and will ensure credit transfer to traditional schools for students exiting detention centers.
- <u>SB 1567</u> requires bulk oils and liquid fuels terminals in the CEI hub (Columbia, Multnomah or Lane County) to submit risk assessments and mitigation plans. A total of \$712k is allocated to the DEQ for implementation.
- \$50 million for Project Turnkey, funding the acquisition of hotels for shelter or housing;
- \$25 million in direct payments to local governments for shelter and other response services, of which \$10 million is for Multnomah County.
- Additional Funds for Affordable Housing Providers.
- Federal earmark for Behavioral Health Resource Center (BHRC).
