The proposal calls for three Councilors per district, 12 in all. You will never know who can help you, or whether they deserve your vote at the next election. Under this proposal, no one is elected to the Council with a citywide point of view, so only the most narrow interests will be at the heart of city policy discussions. Currently, candidates need to win the support of at least 50% +1 of those voting, which controls extreme positions. The ballot measure would increase the role of narrow interests in government.

FEWER CITY SERVICES AND MORE GOVERNMENT

The measure would cost over its first three years an additional \$43.8 million to be spent on elected officials, their staffs, offices and other City Hall expenses. This is taxpayer money that should be spent on direct services to create safer, cleaner and more livable neighborhoods for its citizens.

IT IS AN UNTESTED EXPERIMENT

The combination of multi-member districts and single transferable vote ranked choice voting has never been tried in any community in the United States. It will move us from a form of government no major city uses any more to one that no US city has ever used.

DOESN'T SOLVE OUR CITY'S PROBLEMS

Our city faces deadly serious problems: escalating gun violence, record-breaking homicide rates, homelessness, vandalism, graffiti, and trash. Portland has big complicated problems and City Hall is not delivering solutions. This proposal from the Charter Commission will only make things worse. Reject this proposal and tell the City Council to put a common-sense solution on the ballot in May 2023

This is not the time to experiment with new forms of government and elections.

This ballot measure proposes a government structure and election process that has never worked anywhere in the United States. It is a mistake to trade a failed Commission form of government for one that has never been successful. Why would we do this when there are time-tested solutions. Multnomah County, Metro, Seattle and Denver all have councilors elected by district and a strong executive

This proposal will lead to a City Council of entrenched incumbents

The proposed Council structure and election method gives preferential treatment to incumbent council members and will eventually block new voices from joining the Council. Why? Because an incumbent will have not just one chance to stay in office but three chances. Each district has three positions. An incumbent can be re-elected with just 25% of the votes. Incumbency and name recognition dramatically increase the chance for an incumbent to retain office. Three chances to retain office is too many.

The Election Method for City Council is Flawed

Did you know that your vote might be counted as "surplus."? Here is the text from the proposed charter: "Votes that counted for elected candidates in excess of the threshold are called surplus....the surplus percentage of all votes for the candidates who received a surplus are transferred to the next-highest ranked candidates" The Charter text that defines this scheme is lengthy and complicated. Read the proposed amendment for yourself at Chapter 3, Article 1, Section 3-102 Portland should not be a test case for an experimental election system that has no precedent.

Multimember council districts are a failed idea. Baltimore, the last major city to have them, repealed them two decades ago for very good reasons. Portland should learn Baltimore's lessons, reject this ballot measure, and insist on single-member district representation.

In 2001, I served on a Commission in Baltimore to study the restructuring of its city council. Baltimore's council had turned into a moribund, dysfunctional, unaccountable, unproductive, and unresponsive body, and there was widespread public agreement that things had to change. Ultimately, grassroots organizations (labor unions, League of Women Voters, progressive groups, neighborhood groups) put forward an initiative to replace Baltimore's multimember districts with much smaller single-member districts. It passed with 67% of the vote, despite opposition from most then-existing councilmembers.

Baltimore never looked back. Two decades later, Baltimore's single-member council districts have led to more competitive elections, more active leadership, better neighborhood representation, more independent voices, better accountability, and less inherent incumbent advantage.

What were the lessons learned in Baltimore?

- Mainly, putting multiple councilmembers into the same districts negates the clear accountability and constituent service advantages of districts in the first place. In any other major city, you can "call your councilperson" and you know who to hold responsible for inaction. In Baltimore's multimember districts, councilmembers could simply deflect or hide from responsibility.
- Incumbents had a huge election advantage in Baltimore's multimember districts, and the proposed system in Portland will be worse. Without an ability for voters to single out poor performing incumbents with an up-or-down vote, it will be nearly impossible to hold individual councilmembers accountable.
- Finally, multimember districts require districts that are simply far too large. Smaller, single-member districts offer neighborhood scale representation by local councilmembers with a far better understanding of neighborhood problems.

Multimember districts in Portland won't fix anything but they will make accountability worse. Demand better. Vote no.

No clear representation with multi-member districts. We want single member districts.

Portland is struggling to solve homelessness, public safety and mental health problems. Voters thought we were simply updating our form of government, not experimenting with untested combinations of ideas. The city of Portland is at a critical moment and citizens should not be treated like guinea pigs just because we're tired of the current chaos.

Portlanders want equitable representation

Portland voters overwhelmingly requested that the Charter Review Commission give us district representation versus council members elected 'at large', meaning all City Council members could live in a single neighborhood but are elected by Portland voters citywide.

We agree that in the name of equity, the city should be split into smaller, single-member districts and have elected representatives who live in those districts so they understand the needs of their constituents.

Proposed district sizes are too large

To us, splitting the city into four large districts, each around the size of Salem, does not represent an equitable solution. Priorities will be:

- Neighborhood district representation.

Portland is already in the forefront of election equity. We provide public financing options to support participation. And thanks to the voters of Portland, we have the most diverse City Council in our city's history, elected with broad popular support.

- Rank choice voting decreases voter turn-out: According to research from Jason McDaniel, an associate professor of political science at San Francisco State University, voter turnout decreased (three to five percentage points on average) in cities where ranked choice voting was used.
- Rank choice voting blindsides voters: In Maine, confusion was so overwhelming that proponents had to release a 19-page instruction manual on how to navigate the process.
- Rank choice voting disenfranchises voters: Voters whose first language is not English are more likely to be disenfranchised by this complicated process.
- Rank choice voting cost more: It costs election office more to process the multi-layered voting system. New York spent \$15 million on a "voting education campaign," in part, trying to help deal with confusion brought on by ranked choice voting.
- Rank choice voting delays election results: The new process not only costs more but it takes more time to determine the winner.
