

Safe Street for All Grant Program

Purpose: Assist local governments in meeting a goal of zero deaths and serious injuries on our roads

\$5 billion over 5 years from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

- Will be awarding 100s of Action Plan Grants this year
- Joint applications are encouraged
- 20% local match
- Can apply for implementation grant in future rounds once have an adopted Safety Action Plan (\$5M-\$30M awards)

Proposal

East Multnomah County Safety Action Plan

- Set a goal for reducing deaths and serious injuries
- Conduct a safety risk analysis for our streets
- Engage with the community
- Develop a list of prioritized projects and strategies
- Integrate into our plans

Project Budget: \$450,000

Project Schedule: ~late 2023-2024



EMCTC's Policies

Safety policy statement:

EMCTC is committed to significantly reducing traffic fatalities and serious injuries in East Multnomah County. We must ensure our streets are safe for all residents to travel, especially for those who walk, use bicycles, take transit or use mobility devices. We will prioritize funding for projects that reflect this stance.

Equity policy statement:

EMCTC is committed to improving the lives of residents of East Multnomah County, where there is a greater proportion of low income, Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC) than in the rest of the county. This includes supporting access to jobs, economic opportunities, and education. We will prioritize funding for projects that reflect this stance.

EMCTC's Role

Planning Structure: EMCTC will be the oversight committee and members will champion the Plan within their respective agencies. The Technical Advisory Committee to EMCTC will provide staff level coordination for the Plan through implementation.

Progress and Transparency: Measure progress and outcomes after plan adopted and share with stakeholders on annual basis.

Advocacy: Advocate for funding for East County at regional, state, and federal levels for priority projects from the Plan.

- Vote to approve the letter of support that discusses EMCTC's critical role in the project
