Bylaw Committee Update	<ul> <li>Lynn is putting the revision of the purpose statement on hold as the group works on the definitions.</li> <li>Code of conduct is not aligned with bylaws. It is not trauma informed. Refer to standard procedures rather than a "code of conduct."         <ul> <li>Resolve minor conflict at the lowest level possible.</li> <li>Use a tiered approach for conflict resolution, using county policies for volunteers as a guide.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Bylaws committee will draft some language and bring to the full group for review at the July meeting.</li> </ul>

## **Housing Discussion**

Tiffany Kingery reviewed the system snapshot

Permanent Housing: Housing that is not time limited and the individual's name is on the lease.

Behavioral Health Housing Continuum differs from houselessness services definitions. BH housing includes:

- Secure treatment facilities
- Residential homes with onsite BH services
- Supportive housing array of services
- Transitional/short term housing
- Recovery continuum
- Emergency/shelter/hotels
- Rental assistance
- Permanent Supportive Housing

Question: Will new vouchers be time constrained? RLRA vouchers administered through treatment programs like ACT (Assertive Community Treatment) and ICM (Intensive Case Management) are more flexible.

Lynn reviewed consumer feedback regarding the Housing Planning Grant:

- Addressing the complex needs of people receiving services in the highest levels of care, including the state hospital and secure facilities:
- Expanding access to culturally specific and culturally responsive services;
- Integrating peer delivered services throughout the system based on individualized needs;
- Funding for community-based, "non-clinical" facilities and services that support stability, from SUD peer recovery to supported housing for persons with mental health and SUD needs.
