






What is the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)?

20+ year transportation plan

- Sets the vision and goals for moving people and goods safely, reliably and affordably for decades to come
- Uses projections of future population and job growth to identify travel needs and solutions through 2045
- Includes policies and projects
- Coordinates local, regional, and state investments on regional system
- Establishes priorities for federal and state funding



The RTP is a key tool for implementing the 2040 Growth Concept and Climate Smart Strategy





- Jan. 6 Official call for projects and programs and guidance release; on-line RTP Hub project database system available
- Jan. 29Deadline: Lead agencies submit preliminary list
of priority projects and programs to Metro
- Feb. 17Deadline: Lead agencies submit:
 - required project information through online system (e.g., new/updated GIS data, project description, project cost, modeling details)

- public engagement and non-discrimination certification (Form A)
- endorsement letters from governing body and coordinating committees
