

Large Group: Finalize FY23-24 Allocation	Presenters: Michael Thurman-Noche Summary of Discussion: See slides and Google Sheet.					
	 The Council came back together, and small group leaders presented their suggestions: Blue Group: COLA 4% across the board; 15K in housing, 15,173 in food, 5K in mental health. Food is getting more and more expensive. Housing funding for Clark County only. MH amount due to concern that providers may not be able to spend additional funds. Green Group: 3% COLA; added 45,173 for psychosocial, 25,173 food. Psychosocial – funds would be used to support clients, was prioritized at a previous meeting. Food – prioritized at previous meetings. Did not put money to housing because Part A goes purely to Clark county, and didn't have justification for increasing that. MH – didn't have enough information, and funds would not be enough to increase staffing. Red Group: COLA 4% across the board; 25K in housing (pause on rent increases during pandemic has lifted, amount would make big difference in Clark Co), 10K in food (food is getting more and more expensive). MH needs more money, but even all 55K wouldn't be enough to make a significant impact. 					
	 Comments / Questions: COLA differences – increased COLA (4% vs 3%) allows for less funds to spend in priority areas, which would not allow for additional FTE For Green Group, why such a large amount in psychosocial? Additional psychosocial staff provides support for all of our clients. Also, psychosocial support and mental health are connected Follow up – was there any conversation to add FTE to mental health (which was listed as a priority) instead of psychosocial? Just because we say a service is a priority, that doesn't mean we fund it. Follow up – what would an additional psychosocial position look like? More navigation / support to find resources; though psychosocial is a separate category, it supports all of the categories. Suggestion to merge ideas: 3% COLA; \$45,173 to psychosocial, split \$25,173 between food and housing. What is the justification for more housing funds for Clark County? CAP Clark County is regularly saying no to clients asking for rental assistance due to running out of funding. Also, money goes a lot further when you're not paying for staff. Suggestion: 3.5% COLA; 20K in psychosocial, split remainder between housing and food It doesn't make sense to me to reduce the COLA if we aren't going to fund

	 Just because we put money to a certain category, we don't determine how that money will be used If the money to psychosocial doesn't have a significant impact, then we should go with the red or blue group scenario. Decision: 4% COLA, \$20K to housing, \$15,163 to food. Housing (Clark County) and food both have existing needs.
