Andrew shared a discussion later in the meeting in "Staff Updates" about the Burnside Bridge committee.

 Review and Adoption of Previous Meeting Minutes - All Action Item (00:12:12)

The October 12, 2022 BPCAC meeting minutes were presented for approval. Andrew motioned for an approval (no edits were submitted). Joel Huffman seconded with no opposition.
