

RTP Call for Projects

- RTP Project List is updated every 5 years to reflect current priorities for investment on the regional transportation network
- Each coordinating committee (e.g. EMCTC)
 endorses a financially constrained and strategic
 list of projects based on forecasts of expected
 revenue to submit for the RTP Update



RTP Transportation Networks

Project Eligibility

- 1. Be located on the designated regional transportation system
- 2. Help achieve regional vision, goals and policies
- 3. Cost at least \$2 million
- 4. Come from adopted plans or strategies
- Identified through a process that met public involvement requirements with specific efforts to engage communities of color, people with low-income and people with limited English proficiency.



Draft Project List


- Staff from Multnomah County, Fairview, Gresham, Troutdale, and Wood Village coordinated to develop the updated project list for EMCTC's consideration.
- Staff also coordinated with EMCTC partner agencies: Port, TriMet, and ODOT
- The list reflects priorities from
 - East Metro Connections Plan
 - Cities' Transportation System Plans
 - County Capital Improvement Plan



What's New or Changed since 2018 RTP

- 15 new projects: splitting into smaller sections, TSP amendments, identified in 2020 County CIP, long-range projects
- Cost Estimates: Newer cost estimates from CIP, adding inflation assumptions, escalating to "Year of Expenditure" estimates
- New committed funding to advance projects
- Clean up: removing completed projects, providing more public friendly names and descriptions, applying changes in Metro guidance


Type of Investments in the Constrained List



Project List Highlights

- East Metro Connections Plan
 - 10 projects nominated by Multnomah County (all on constrained list)
 - 21 projects nominated by Gresham (16 on constrained and 5 on strategic)
- Multijurisdictional projects, e.g. Main Streets on Halsey
- Safety projects, e.g. 181st, 223rd, 257th, Sandy, Troutdale Rd, and Safe Streets Project Implementation
- Trail projects, e.g. Sandy River Trail and Gresham-Fairview Trail
- 2 roundabouts
- East County Bridge projects: Stark St, Pleasant View, 2nd St Bike/Ped
- Outside of East County: Earthquake Ready Burnside Bridge, Willamette River bridges maintenance, Scholl's Ferry Rd
