What Does the Preschool and Early Learning Division Do?

Voters in Multnomah County overwhelmingly supported "Preschool for All" on November 3rd, 2020, with 64 percent of voters approving the measure to extend publicly-funded early education to children across the County. The Preschool & Early Learning Division was created to administer the program.

Preschool for All (PFA) connects 3 and 4 year olds in Multnomah County to free, culturally responsive, inclusive preschool experiences. The program will grow over time, increasing the number of children and families that it serves each year, reaching universal preschool access by 2030.

Internship Description & Responsibilities:

 Document and share stories of PFA's impact on families and preschool providers around the county





- Work with Division and County communications teams, including photographers and videographers, to turn these stories into public-facing communications products. This will include writing content and providing feedback on draft communications materials.
- Contribute to development and implementation of Preschool for All communications and public relations strategies
