What Does Vector Control Do?

Vector Control is one department of Environmental Health Services which is part of the Public Health division in the Health Department. Vector Control monitors, suppresses or maintains at acceptable levels, a range of emerging and existing local public health vector populations in order to improve or sustain community livability and safety.

Internship Description & Responsibilities:

This internship will support the Vector Control program to monitor various vector populations. Responsibilities in the role will include:

- Assist in monitoring mosquito populations by collecting adult mosquitoes throughout Multnomah County using various types of traps. Requires the ability to walk over rough terrain for up to 0.5 miles while carrying equipment.
- Collection of dead birds for disease monitoring and testing which requires training in and use of biohazard protocols.





- Assist in identifying and preparing mosquito samples for testing and shipping. Requires high levels of physical dexterity and extended periods of using a microscope.
- Assist with the trapping and testing of live rodents for disease surveillance using AVMA standards for humane treatment and euthanasia.
- Collect samples of larval mosquitoes from a variety of natural and built environments. Apply larval control products throughout the County under the supervision of the Lead Public Health Vector Control Specialist. Requires walking in rough and uneven terrain and lifting manhole covers for product placement.
- The opportunity to attend in-person community outreach events throughout the County, representing environmental health and vector control

Learning Outcomes:

During this internship you can expect to:

- Learn how an Integrated Pest Management program is used to protect public health, enhance livability, and protect the environment.
- Learn Vector Control lab protocols, including lab safety protocols.
- Learn Vector Control field work and safety protocols.
- Connect to key staff who can help you deepen your understanding of environmental health and public service.
- Receive valuable feedback on strengths and areas for improvement to forward your public health or science career.

Education and Minimum Qualifications:

- Candidates should have completed or enrolled in a college/university academic institution preferably with a public health or science focus.
