

Organizational Chart



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FY 2023 Successes

- Preparing Policy for 2023 Legislative Session:
 - Improving the Drug Treatment and Addiction Recovery Act Fund, BHRN coordination with LMHA's, and ensure funding can expand services for individuals with dual diagnoses.
 - Burnside Funding package including direct allocation and special district.
 - Banning display of donated bodies.
 - Transparency in Community Mental Health Budgeting.
 - Funding for Behavioral Health, Public Health, Homelessness Services and more.
- Received a \$2 million FY23 Earmark/Community Project Funding to support EQRB Design.
- Two Community Project Funding requests (\$2 million for Cook Plaza and \$400K for MCDA Gun Violence) selected by Congressman Blumenauer to propose for the FY24 Federal Budget.
- Worked with broad partner coalitions to assess, plan, and submit grant applications to support public safety, behavioral health, sustainability, and infrastructure projects.
