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#### WHAT DO WE WANT TO BETTER UNDERSTAND?

- 1. Is the PSA valid for predicting failure to appear, new crime, and new violent crime for the overall pretrial release population?
- 2. Is the PSA valid for predicting failure to appear, new crime, and new violent crime for unique subpopulations?
- 3. Does the Release Condition Matrix enhance the impact of the PSA?



#### Validation Limitations

- 1. Validation will focus on the validity of the PSA and should not be used to generalize to the effectiveness of Multnomah County's pretrial system.
- 2. A validation study will only apply to those individuals who were released during the pretrial phase. There may be a significant number of people held for the duration of their pretrial case—releasing a portion of these may have a substantive impact on the validity of the instrument.
- 3. The validity of the instrument is contingent on the system's response to behavior.

### How Will This Be Accomplished?

- 1. Examine the population differences between individuals who were released compared to those who were held to determine what the differences were between the two populations.
- 2. Examine the validity of each Public Safety Assessment scale on the overall population as well as within race/ethnicity, gender, and pretrial interventions.
- 3. Examine the validity of each Public Safety Assessment risk factor.
- 4. Explore the impacts of the pretrial system on the validity of the Public Safety Assessment.
