

The data presented in this report represent real people – members of our community. These people are sisters, brothers, mothers, fathers, and friends in our county.




Traffic crash deaths in Multnomah County, 2012-2022






Driving went down in 2020, but deaths of people walking increased 4.7%

2021 deaths will likely represent a historic one-year increase






