

Medical Examiner Data 2022

- The medical examiner investigates deaths that are apparently accidental or following an injury
- Deaths listed as "Domicile Unknown" were included in this analysis




In 2022, there were **315** deaths among people experiencing homelessness

144 were unintentional injuries

14 were traffic fatalities



Transportation-related deaths



Compared to the general population, people experiencing homelessness were **45 times** more likely to die in a traffic accident
