The ACHP is continually working on quality improvement initiatives. One area that has needed improvement is the application process for new adult care home licenses. Opening an adult care home is a considerable venture to take on. Both the operator and the adult care home property are required to fulfill many requirements. Some applicants are renting homes that will not meet the ACHP requirements, or they are not prepared financially for this huge commitment.	Opening an adult care home is a significant commitment, and a large investment of time and financial resources. Applicants face other barriers to success. APD Medicaid rates have remained low. The number of I/DD residents has decreased in Multnomah County. As a result providers ended up with an empty home, with no choice than to close and join the workforce again. Unscrupulous landlords charge applicants very high rent and lock them into years-long leases. The ACHP wants to do what it can to help applicants have better outcomes. Please help us spread the word that starting Monday, April 1, the ACHP is launching a new application process. There are three major changes:
The state now requires an additional form be submitted directly to them. All staff should complete the training before operators submit an attestation.
