### What does the Department of Community Justice Do?

Dedicated to *Community Safety Through Positive Change*, the Department of Community Justice (DCJ) serves a vital role in protecting public safety and strengthening communities. DCJ intervenes to prevent the recurrence of crime by providing supervision, sanctions, and treatment resources to youth, adults, families, and communities to address the underlying problems that drive crime.

### How does the Communications Intern support this work?

The Communications Intern will be a part of a diverse and dynamic team of professionals responsible for crafting messaging, providing transparent updates and information, and encouraging dialogue among staff, leadership and the general public about public safety. Additional team members oversee the creation and adherence of division policies, and the Volunteer & Intern Programs Manager, also a member of the team, supports community outreach and involvement efforts.

### Internship Description & Responsibilities:

The Multnomah County Department of Community Justice's Director's Office is seeking qualified candidates for a temporary paid internship position. This internship will be





conducted with our Communications staff, supporting of internal and external communications within the

department. Learning and project opportunities in the following areas; strategic planning, web development and maintenance, graphic design and data visualization, change management, internal communication strategies, diverse modes of storytelling, organizational culture, mediation, active listening and equity & inclusion. Possible project examples and responsibilities include:

- Helping to paint murals with both staff and clients with trauma-informed themes
- Learning and/or participating in graphic recording and facilitation
- Interviewing staff and collecting stories from the field for our internal newsletter and website
- Contributing to the creative process and idea generation
- Storyboarding and content design, including creating templates for print & web
- Creating, editing, and sharing visual and written communication content internally
- Administrative tasks such as emailing and note taking
- Conducting in-person outreach at community events and with partner organizations
- Learn about County policies, with an emphasis on privacy safeguards, and about effective internal communication of these policies
