


FY 2013 Budget: \$58.1 Million

- Funding pending from The Library Foundation
- Uses \$4.1 million from Beginning Working Balance
- Uses \$3.4 million one-time-only General Fund




Library Fund Balance






Budget by Division – Library Fund






Budget by Spending Category






Budget by Funding Source

- Services for seniors, job seekers, small business owners, new residents (80005, 80006, 80020)
- New books, magazines and other materials (80013)




Reductions

- Closing Mondays at all libraries
- Open hours reduced from 53 or 57 per week to 44
- Book budget reduced by \$1 million
- FTE: 43 cut
- Reduced access, services




Open Hours History






Main Library Open Hours Per Week: MCL & Peers

Impacts


- Mitigation strategies
 - Expect one year gap; plan for three years
 - Leverage resources for greatest benefit
 - Focus on services within the buildings
 - Coordinate and centralize wherever possible
- Risks
 - Ability to manage the workload
 - Reduced and restricted resources
