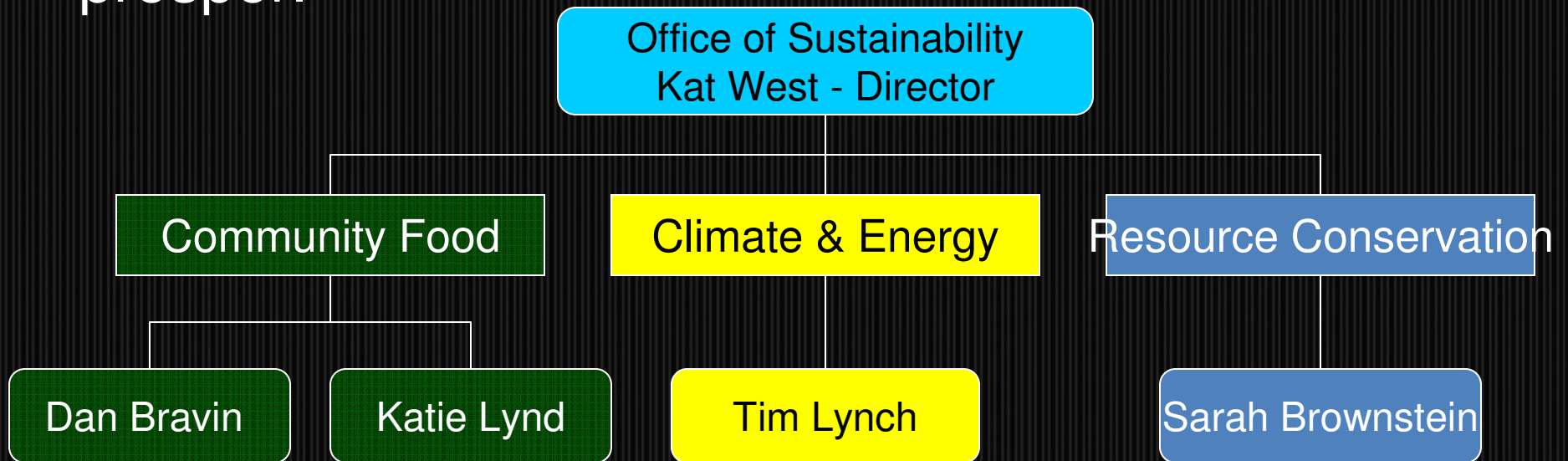
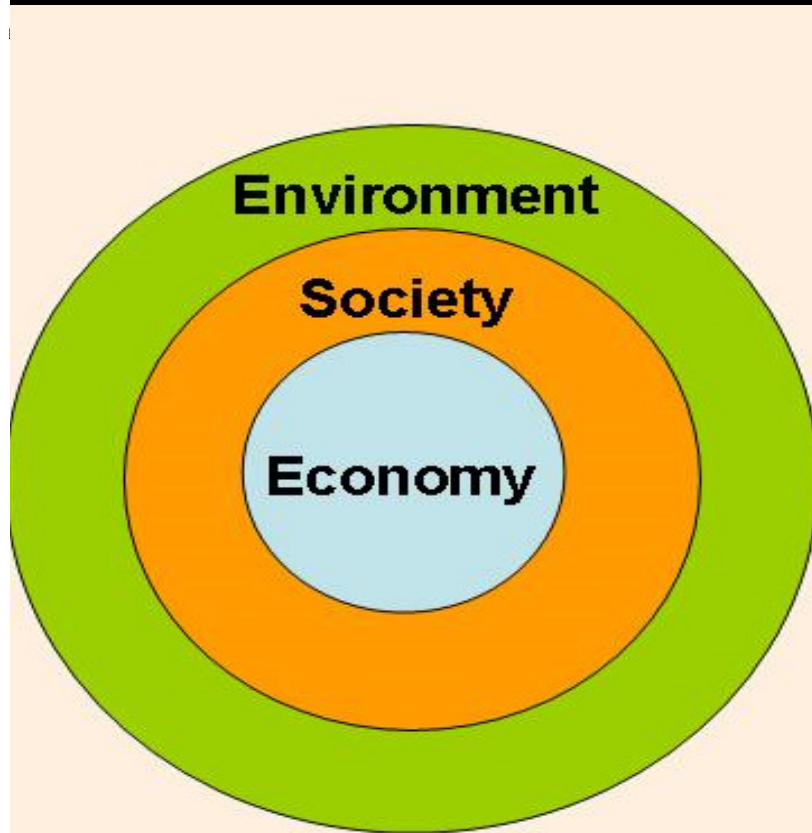

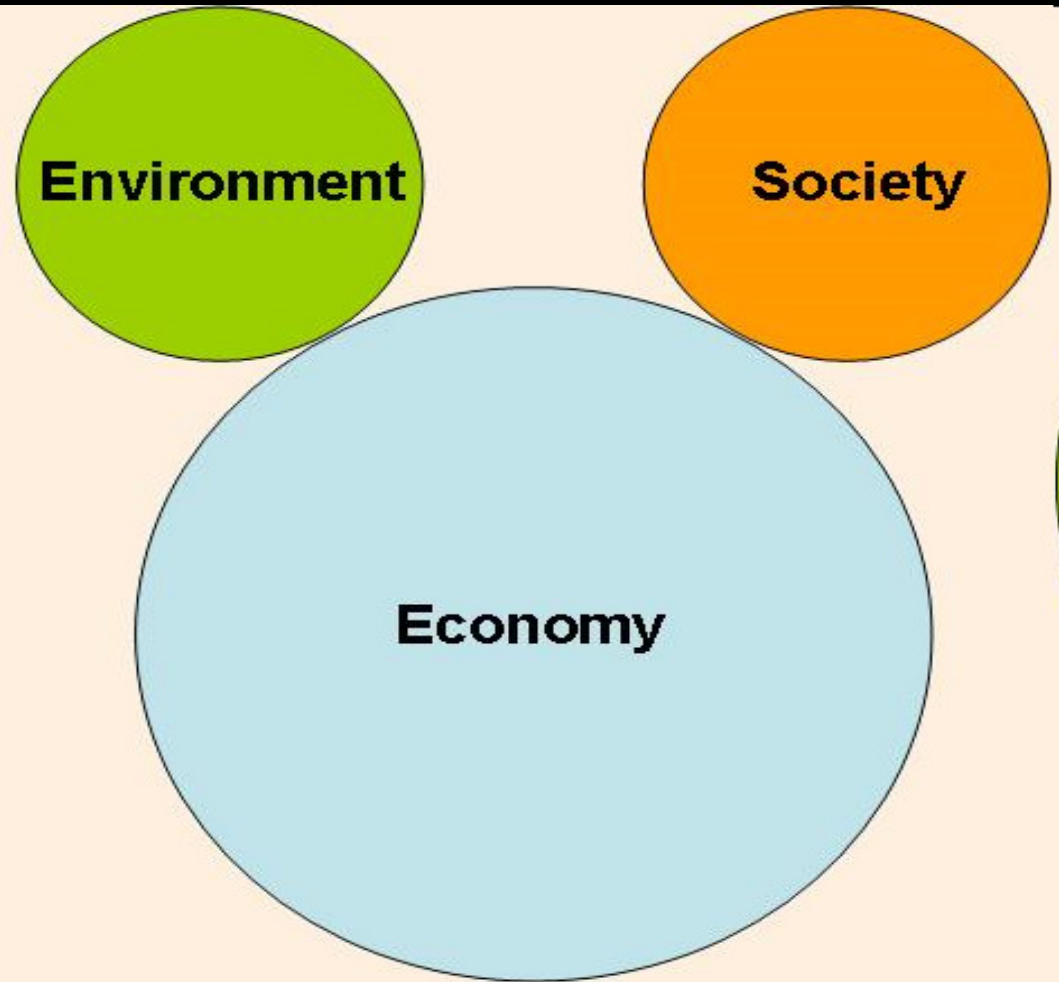

 - Grants – FY 09 & FY10 - \$550,000

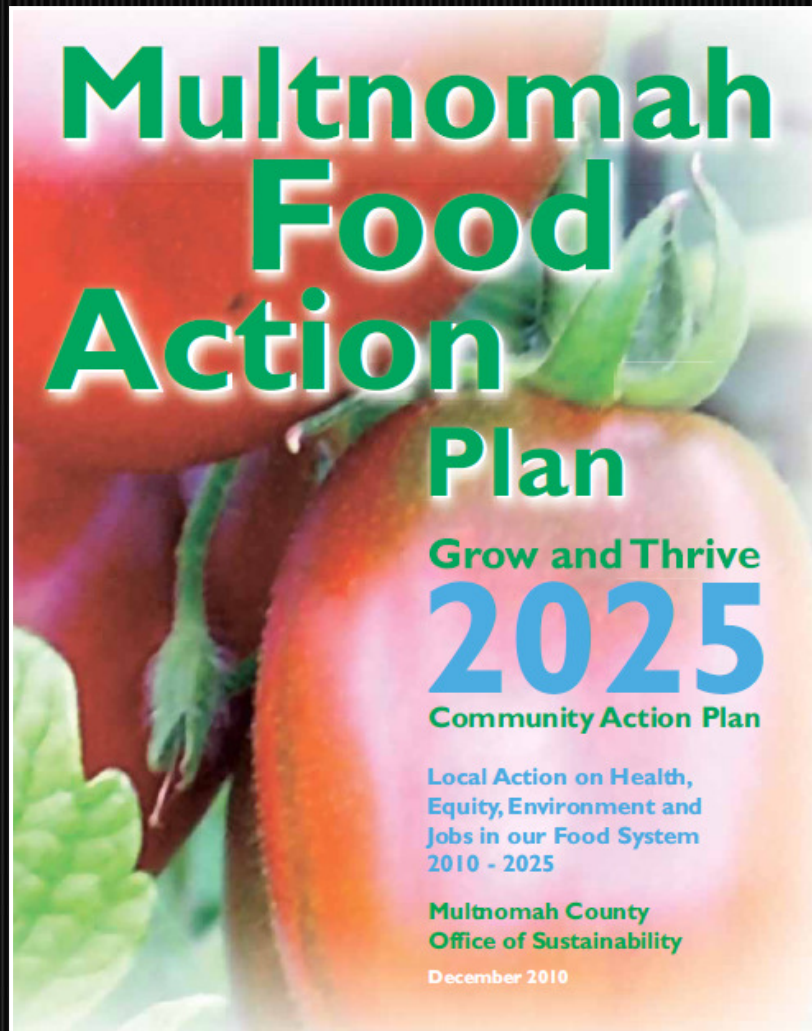
