Service Area & Target Groups/Focus

Children, adults and families who are homeless, living in poverty and/or at risk of academic failure – primarily from school neighborhood, but services are open to anyone.

School Population: 443 students; Grades PK-8; 100% Eligible for Free Meals;
84% Students of Color (African American 51%, American Indian/AK Native <1%, Asian 2%, Hispanic 23%, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander 5%, Multiple Race 4%, White 16%)

Outputs

230 youth served

92% students of color

53% identified as being “at risk of academic failure”

100% qualified for free and reduced lunch

54 adults served

582 people served in non-enrollment events

(family educational nights, cultural fairs, etc.)

Outcomes

86% of students increased benchmark scores in Reading *

79% of students increased benchmark scores in Math *

Average daily attendance of SUN CS students was **92%**

SUN Spotlight

Woodlawn School was awarded the SIG grant this year, which allowed more funding to support our students. In particular, Woodlawn SUN was able to put **ALL SUN students** in extended learning with a certified teacher for one hour after school. Students clearly understand their work more and teachers are seeing students turning in homework more consistently and on time.
