Children, adults and families who are homeless, living in poverty and/or at risk of academic failure – primarily from school neighborhood, but services are open to anyone.

School Population: 685 students; Grades K-8; 45% Free and Reduced Lunch; 41% Students of Color (African American 5%, American Indian/AK Native <1%, Asian 16%, Hispanic 8%, Native Hawaiian/AK Native <1%, Multiple Race 12%, White 59%)
