Service Area & Target Groups/Focus

Children, adults and families who are homeless, living in poverty and/or at risk of academic failure – primarily from school neighborhood, but services are open to anyone.

SUN Spotlight

Mt. Tabor SUN Community School continues to be a thriving program. It has existed at Mt. Tabor Middle School since 1978. There are activities for youth and families at Mt. Tabor SCS Monday – Friday after school and Monday – Thursday evenings until 9pm.

The Jazz Band was without an instructor when school began & resumed in January to great success. It met 2-3 times a week before school and has 25 members. There were 25

Mt. Tabor community & neighborhood basketball teams this winter participating in the Saturday Youth Basketball leagues as well as the PIL winter basketball program, serving over 250 students. We are in our 4th year of Girls, Inc. as part of a grant that serves the Franklin HS cluster.

Evening adult programming included, Crafts, PP&R Adaptive & Inclusive (AIR)
Creative Art for Adults with Disabilities, Belly Dancing, Yoga, and the Aratas Hungarian Folk Dance group. We also facilitate Portland Community College's Adult Education program, by hosting the classes they schedule each term to be held at Mt. Tabor Middle School. This year two PCC classes were successfully held at Mt. Tabor, & this will continue into fall term 2016.
