Outcomes

68% of students increased benchmark scores in Reading *
78% of students increased benchmark scores in Math *
Average daily attendance of SUN CS students was **76%**

SUN Spotlight

Portland Parks and Recreation’s Lane SUN Community School recently launched their new Mobile Food Pantry on April 21st, 2016. The pantry is open year around on Thursday evenings from 4:00-5:30pm. The pantry is for families and students of Lane Middle School to shop for food that can feed their entire household for 3-4 days. The pantry distributes fresh fruits and vegetables, meats, dairy, breads, dry goods and much more! The pantry has been a huge success in distributing over 40,000 pounds of food to 195 deserving families! The pantry is made possible by the collaboration with Oregon Food Bank which provides the school pantries with quality food, much of which is donated from local farmers and grocery stores. This is one of many great programs that are offered through SUN that benefit the communities in our city.
