Children, adults and families who are homeless, living in poverty and/or at risk of academic failure – primarily from school neighborhood, but services are open to anyone.

School Population: 376 students; Grades K-5; 61% Free and Reduced Lunch; 49% Students of Color (African American 14%, American Indian/AK Native 1%, Asian 10%, Hispanic 13%, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander 1%, Multiple Race 10%, White 51%)

Outcomes

70% of students increased benchmark scores in Reading *
81% of students increased benchmark scores in Math *
Average daily attendance of SUN CS students was 96%

SUN Spotlight

"With donations from the PTA plant sale & Home Depot."

"With water. Plants use water to carry moisture and nutrients back and forth between the roots and leaves." "With insects, that pollinate plants

and help plants reproduce."

"With teamwork!"

"With fresh, clean air and sunlight. Dirty air caused by pollution can block out sunlight."

"With soil and compost, to feed plants and help control diseases." "With time and patience. Lots of patience."
