

## **MULTNOMAH COUNTY JAIL STATISTICS: AUGUST 2008**

## **Key Statistics**<sup>1</sup>:

- → The total number of average daily filled jail beds: 1,381<sup>2</sup>
- → The average daily jail beds filled exclusively under the contract with U.S. Marshal's Office<sup>3</sup>: **133** The number of billed jail beds<sup>4</sup> under USM contract: **138**
- → The average daily jail beds filled under SB1145 (Local Control population): 116
- → The average daily jail beds filled exclusively by Parole or Probation violations<sup>5</sup>: **359**
- → The number of Emergency Population Releases: 0
- → The number of field-based work release (FBWR) program participants<sup>6</sup>: 23 The number of jail bed days saved due to FBWR: 664 (equivalent to 21 jail beds).
- → The number of inmates referred to treatments: 22. The number of inmates placed into treatments: 4. Average number of inmates on the treatment waiting list in September: 54
- → CANS made a total of 2,988 hearing notifications with 81% call success rate. Of those who received a successful reminder, about 93% appeared to hearings<sup>7</sup>.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> This represents 89.7% of total County operational jail bed capacity (N=1539). Capacity at 97% or higher is considered a Population Emergency. In-transit bookings were excluded from the total bed use calculation.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> This number does not include 21 non-exclusive USM beds that were reported in other categories.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> The number of billed USM beds is a result of negotiation and data reconciliation between the County and US Marshal's office. It may not be the same number as pulled out from the DSS-J system.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> Started in May 2008, this number also includes <u>any combinations</u> of post-prison, parole, or probation supervision violation holds that were previously grouped in the 'Multiple Holds' category.
