











Notes: Reported index offenses continued their decline; Portland reported a 16% decrease and Gresham reported an 18% decrease compared to this time last year (PPB) due to decreases in most *Property* crimes—large drops in auto-related thefts and home and commercial burglaries. Standard bookings increased inline with increased arrests over April. The MCSO reported 247 matrix releases in May (avg. 8.0/day) and the average length of stay (ALS) was 17 days per bookings slightly lower than April. May's overall jail utilization was 99.3%, leaving only 12 beds available on any given day.









Notes: The DA adult case data reflects changes in the coding of *Drug* charges. Average daily sentencing outcomes increased overall 21% from April; *Drug, Behavioral, Local Charges,* and *Vehicle* convictions increased while all other conviction types remained at levels similar to April's. The Adult community supervision total caseload continued their rising trend since April 2005 with a May 2006 showing 1.3% increase over the previous month, while the juvenile caseload remained largely unchanged.
