











Notes: Reported index offenses are 15% lower compared to this time last year (PPB). Average daily arrests decreased slightly with reductions in most categories. The proportion felony arrests declined, possibly due to increases in *local charges* (these are typically drug/ prostitution free zone violations). Standard bookings declined 12%. The MCSO reported 126 matrix releases in February (avg. 4.5/day) and the average length of stay (ALS) remained virtually the same as January (18/days per booking). February's overall jail utilization was 98.6%, leaving only 23 beds available on any given day.









Notes: The DA adult cases remained largely unchanged; reduction in new *Drug* cases were off-set by increases in *Other Charges*. Average daily sentencing outcomes increased 15% from January, led by a doubling in *Drug* convictions but tempered by substantial declines in *Other/Local* convictions. DCJ's juvenile caseload continues its trend of increasing risk with shifts from *Low/Unclassified/Other Risk* caseloads to *High-Medium Risk* caseloads.
