











Notes: Year-to-date reported Part I Offenses are -7% (PPB) and -5% (GPD) lower than last year at this time. Average Daily Arrests declined sharply in all types except *Vehicle/DUII*. Average Daily *Standard Bookings* continued their three month decline. The average daily capacity increased to 1576, due to the addition of 57 Portland beds at MCIJ (P57). The decline in arrests and subsequent bookings combined with the additional 57 beds reduced the number of matrix releases to 227 (avg. 7.6/day), the lowest since 11/04. The Average Length of Stay (ALS) increased 4.6 days to 17.6 days









Notes: The DA Adult Cases Received remained largely the same as October. The Adult Supervision increased slightly due to increases in the Non-Specialized and Specialized caseloads. Early 2004 adult Specialized and Non-Specialized trend values were revised upward slightly due to an immaterial miscalculation. Juvenile Justice Caseload declined slightly due to a decline in the low-risk caseload.
