



Multnomah County Children by School District Census 2000 Data





Note: District census from 2000 US Census. Census includes all children living in the boundaries of that district, whether or not they are enrolled in public school.




Multnomah County Services For Children Fiscal Year 2001-2002

Multnomah County School Allocated Dollars Per Child by District FY2001-2002




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
Allocation of Multnomah County School Based Dollars By School District FY2001-2002




Multnomah County School Based Services FY2001-2002 Adopted Budget






Health Department Programs for Children






Percent of Health Department Dollars by School District FY2001-2001 Adopted Budget






Juvenile Justice Programs






Allocation of Juvenile Justice School Based Dollars FY2001-2002 Adopted Budget





Summary

- There is a disparity between school districts in the overall distribution of school-based dollars for FY2001-2002
- Only 12% of the dollars for services to children are school-based
- Some of the disparity in the distribution of schoolbased health dollars could be addressed by accessing community based health programs



Summary-continued

- Overall, Juvenile Justice School-Based
 Programs are close to equitably distributed
- More attention should be focused on the distribution of Community & Family Services school-based program dollars.
 - a. Check allocations for accuracy
 - b. Improve access to community based programs
 - c. Work on distribution of school-based programs.
