Veterans Toolkit and Veterans Preference Shawn Postera	Shawn presented the veteran toolkit that has been developed by the Office of Diversity and Equity to help recruiters and hiring managers understand the skills and assets that veteran candidates bring. The questions guiding this work are how do you recruit veterans, and how do you retain them? Toolkit includes skills veterans bring (hard and soft skills), benefits of hiring veterans, best practices, and strategies to streamline the veteran preference process.  Where do we go with this?  Task force recommended taking this presentation to AOC veterans committee, the NACo committee, Craig Sticker with the National Guard, the Multnomah County Business Advisory Council, and do outreach to help apply it to the private sector. Veteran Critical Home Repair Program Mark Forker	This is a program through Habitat for Humanity with support from Home Depot Foundation. The Willamette West office's service area is from the Willamette River to Hillsboro, but the Veterans program isn't offered by other local Habitat affiliates so there may be more geographic flexibility for qualified veterans in this program. They have \$30k to go toward two critical home repair projects this spring, which can cover work such as roofs, HVAC, structural, plumbing, or electrical repairs. Out of 1500 habitat affiliates across the country there are 80-90 who have this grant, with potential to reapply next cycle if they can demonstrate the local need. Broad agreement on task force that there is a need and we should help with outreach to connect veterans with this service. "Sweat equity" is highly valued and it was emphasized that this is a hand up to a veteran in need. Candidates need to be over 18 and fall between 30-60% of median household income in Washington County. Can be a renter, but homeowner needs to live at the residence also. Joining Community Forces – Community Covenant  Elan Lambert & Sean Files	Elan provided overview of the Joining Community Forces initiative, which seeks to foster and sustain meaningful relationships between military and civilian worlds. The board passed a resolution on March $21^{st}$ to convene a steering committee and begin work on the Community Covenant and community action plan. First meeting will be May $6^{th}$ at $10:30$ am after the VTF. When reintegration funding ends it will be the responsibility of our communities to support veterans, and this effort will provide the structured undergirding for these resources. The action plan will include what's happening now, who's doing what, and where are the gaps. 	RONA — Jonathan reported that federal offices can contact every veteran in the state who receives VA benefits, possibly for public outreach program. Also, Jonathan described an event that Sen. Wyden is working on for Veteran's Day. More updates at future meetings.	
	Faith Summit in East Multnomah County — On April 18 <sup>th</sup> , Commissioner McKeel will co-host a faith summit at Parklane Church, located at 160 <sup>th</sup> and Main. Faith leaders have been invited to learn more about the county's work and opportunity to partner.	Sean and Elan will staff a table for veteran services
	USO Vets Center — USO has announced that there will be a vets center at the Portland Airport. This will be the first time this resource is available at PDX.	Sean will follow up to have a presentation at a future VTF meeting
	Veterans Docket — Keith reported that protocols are being developed around community court to set up a veterans' docket, possibly as a dedicated day for veterans at community court. The Criminal Justice Commission approved funding and a position should be posted soon to develop the framework for it.
