Some suggestions were:  • Possibly mirror the report to the adult side version • Look at cross-over youth as well as BM-11 youth • Include school discipline and sex offenses  If the report becomes too large or cumbersome, it was suggested to use the data for council review and reference. Open Discussion	Debbie Hansen from Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) stated the legislature has recently ratified the interstate compact and there will be future trainings provided before December 2010. These 1 hour trainings are being coordinated through Mark Fry, JSD Placement Coordinator possibly in December and may be combined with other counties. These changes will be seen in increased sanctions and fines for not following the procedures and practices.  The council expressed concern regarding level of offense, and issues regarding sex offenders. Currently, the Juvenile interstate compact is designed similarly to the adult side.
