Multnomah County Microloan Program John Tydlaska	Commissioner McKeel invited John to present to raise more awareness about this microlending program to better connect with veterans who are looking to start their own business.  The county's microloan program started about 18 months ago with the goal of helping people we serve to be more economically self-sufficient. It is a partnership with MercyCorps NW and Microloan Enterprise of Oregon to provide technical assistance along with small scale loans. Ten of the loans last year were for less than \$5,000 each, and in all the program loaned out \$500k. As they get repaid, there will be more funds to get loaned out.  Criteria: At or below median income, and must be a Multnomah County resident.  Discussion:  Encouraged to partner more with SBA, OAME, SBDCs and Score to raise awareness and broaden the services available.  Discussed ways to run a kickstarter/KIVA-type program to raise seed money. Beginning Urban Famer Program Dan Bravin	Like the microlending presentation, the goal of this presentation was to improve outreach to veterans who may be interested in this farming and agricultural small business program. Dan presented on the Beginning Urban Farmer Apprenticeship (BUFA) program, which is a partnership between the Multnomah County Office of Sustainability and the OSU Extension program. It is a season-long course for entry-level farmers, running from April to October. There is a classroom and field trip component, and a field-work part to the course. The program is designed to prepare students for joining a business or starting their own small-scale farming operation.  The intensive track consists of two full days per week and one weekend per month. The other track is weekend and evenings but does not include the hands-on fieldwork. The BUFA program has a comprehensive curriculum that includes business, sales at the market, seed starting, and growing. There is a small business class at the end of the course. Upon completion, graduates get a certificate from the county and OSU. There were 15-20 students last year (65 applied) and will increase to 30 students in this year's course. Tuition is \$3,000 for track 1, and \$1200 for track 2 – scholarships are available. General Updates All	Partners in Careers: Pam- Pam discussed the Partners in Careers program, funded by a US Dept. of Labor grant for homeless women and veterans with children. The primary focus is on employment. Working with fifty families in Multnomah and two other counties. To be eligible they need a DD214 with anything but dishonorable discharge and be homeless. For a homeless male to be eligible, they need to have over 51% of custody of their child.  They have a good partnership with local nonprofits, the county, and Mt.
