Commissioner Judy Shiprack called the meeting to order.

State Representative Jennifer Williamson of House District 36 was introduced as the replacement for State Representative Chris Garrett on the LPSCC Executive Committee.

Rebecca Stavenjord, coordinator for the $\underline{\mathsf{STRYVE}}$ Initiative, was introduced as the liaison for Lillian Shirley the Public Health representative to the LPSCC Executive Committee

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County

Brian Detman was introduced as a new senior policy advisor for Multnomah County Chair Cogen.

Co-Chair Shiprack presented outgoing Executive Director Peter Ozanne with a plaque as a thank you for his service to LPSCC.

Co-Chair Shiprack updated the committee on the search for the replacement Executive Director. Interviews had been scheduled with the eight finalists and a new director should be selected by June.

Youth & Gang Violence Subcommittee

Mayor Charlie Hales informed the Executive Committee of the City's commitment to reducing gang violence and improving public safety.

Subcommittee Chair Baruti Artharee updated the Executive Committee on the progress of reenergizing the Youth & Gang Violence Subcommittee. A series of small meetings will be scheduled to finalize a work plan before convening the full subcommittee.

Erika Preuitt presented on the Department of Community Justice's gang suppression efforts. Art Nakamura of the Portland Police Bureau Gang Enforcement Task Force informed the committee of street level trends in gang crime. Community Member Kim Filla discussed the positive impact the Portland Opportunities Industrialization Center had on her family.

Justice Reinvestment in Oregon and Multnomah County

State Rep. Williamson gave an update on the progress for finalizing the state's public safety budget. The state considered legislation to reduce prison population growth through local justice reinvestment. The proposal assumes the state will save money by holding the prison population flat and these savings could then be reinvested in the local criminal justice systems that contributed to the reduction in prison population growth. The Executive Committee continued the discussion on this legislation that started with the Justice Reinvestment Workgroup. The Workgroup met eight times to discuss potential ways to reduce Multnomah County's contribution to the Oregon prison population. The status and content of the proposed justice reinvestment legislation was uncertain at the time of the discussion. Concern was expressed on whether the State's proposed financial incentives would be enough to offset the cost of implementing changes locally. Due to the uncertainty of the proposed legislation the workgroup was unable to develop specific recommendations. The workgroup was able to create a blueprint for interagency cooperation that could be beneficial to other counties.

Action Item: The Justice Reinvestment Workgroup was given the LPSCC Executive Committee's permission to discuss their cooperative efforts with the state legislature.
