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
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#### Vision Statement





## Needs Assessment

- <u>Law Enforcement</u>: violent crimes and assault, crimes with firearm, police stops and calls, gang affiliation, exclusions, re-entry populations, crimes by juveniles.
- <u>School:</u> free and reduced lunch rates, school report cards, PPS school achievement milestones, six district suspension/expulsion data (rates and reasons for exclusion by race/ethnicity)
- <u>Census</u>: poverty and 200% poverty rate, race/ethnicity, employment, housing, disaggregated education, employment and family demographics
- <u>Health Indicators:</u> teen pregnancy, alcohol retailer density, injury and mortality, violent deaths, suicide, maternal and child health





  - Strategy: Increase Community Resiliency

  - Strategy: Engage Community Health Workers
  - Strategy: Individual and Organizational Capacity
- Commitment to School
  - Strategy: Youth Leadership in Community Change, YES


