Welcome to the Public Safety Trends Summary Report produced by Multnomah County's Local Public Safety Coordinating Council (LPSCC). The purpose of this report is to provide an executive level summary of operational data for many of the decision points in the County's Public Safety System for the Council's Executive Committee, partner agency staff, and members of the public.

The statistics detailed in this report are sourced from the County's Decision Support System – Justice data warehouse (DSSJ). The data contained in DSSJ is sourced from the host agency systems and is regularly audited for accuracy. Additionally, the data presented in this report is regularly reviewed by the owner agency analysts for consistency and clarity.

The Report provides both long-term trend data and short-term descriptive statistics. The long-term trends section provides a description of how certain types of events, case types, and charge levels have changed over time. The short-term trends section provides a more detailed description of the data presented in the long-term trend section. Measures of reported Incidents, Arrest, Disposition, and Sentencing are reported at the case unit level. Measures for Booking and Custody are reported at the person level.

The Public Safety Trends Report is produced on a regular basis and serves as a starting point for broader investigations of trends in local public safety. Frequently, the Report will contain a special analysis section providing a systems perspective of specific areas in the local public safety system.

Items of Note and Updates

Reported Part 1 offenses, arrests, and bookings have all experienced slight decreasing trends between March 2014 and May 2014.


There was an increase in jail bed usage for exclusive U.S. Marshal custodies in May 2014 when compared to April of 2014. No jail beds were used for U.S. Immigration custodies in May 2014.

There are four new charts highlighting trends in prosecution decision points. The first set of new charts is designed to highlight long-term and short-term trends in case review outcomes – an early decision point in the prosecution process. The second set of new charts is designed to highlight long-term and short-term trends in disposed prosecution cases – a late decision point in the prosecution process. Some narrative is provided on the charts to help familiarize readers with this new content.




Average Daily Reported Part 1 Offenses for May 2014








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Average Daily Arrests by Charge Level*


Average Daily Arrests by Type in May 2014*









