The loss of attorney positions necessitates the reduction in services that our office provides. The following changes will take effect July 13, 2009. Cases that are already issued will be processed to completion.	If you have questions or need more information, contact:
Tom Cleary	 Our office will no longer review police reports for legal sufficiency except those involving a person felony or gun charge The school liaison position is eliminated Our office will not issue or prosecute misdemeanor cases except those that include physical injury, resisting arrest, menacing and major traffic cases (i.e., DUII, H&R, Reckless and Elude). Exceptions may be made in extreme cases with prior approval of Sr. DDA or Chief DDA. Misdemeanors involving Tri Met facilities, property or vehicles may be pursued formally after consultation with the Tri Met DDA.
