## **Introductions, Announcements, and Approval of Minutes**

LPSCC Co-Chair, Commissioner Shiprack, called the meeting to order.

## **Public Safety Trends Report**

LPSCC Analyst Lauren Brown presented on the monthly [Public Safety Trend Report](#). The report is created using data from the Decision Support System - Justice (DSSJ) data warehouse. The process of incorporating data from the Court's new data system into DSSJ is ongoing. Some charts featuring data from the court system may be missing from the report during this process. Future editions of the report will feature new content including a section on prosecution decisions points. A chart highlighting outcomes for supervision custody cycle closures was discussed.

Michael Schmidt, from the Criminal Justice Commission, shared an update on statewide prison use and the implementation of justice reinvestment. The presentation concluded with information about Yamhill, Marion, and Clackamas County's plans for Justice Reinvestment.
