## **Executive Summary**

Provides funding for the District Attorney to purchase data storage hardware (500 TB) for the anticipated large volumes of digital evidence expected as a consequence of body worn camera implementation at the Portland Police Bureau and other law enforcement agencies. Current data storage capacity is insufficient to handle the anticipated storage requirements. New equipment purchase and installation will be entirely managed by existing MCDA IT and Purchasing Staff.

## **Program Summary**

Implementation of body worn cameras for all uniformed Portland Police Bureau members presents a significant opportunity to increase transparency, police accountability and provide the community with enhanced community protection. This technology, however, carries significant challenges and costs both to law enforcement and the District Attorney. Primarily, we expect these systems to collect large quantities of data that must be preserved and distributed to the components of the criminal justice system: the District Attorney's Office, the Courts and the Defense. Additionally, this video will need to be edited, redacted and compiled on a case by case basis by persons with expertise in the field. Thus, this program request will provide funding to enable the District Attorney to purchase the infrastructure to handle the volume of data expected to be transmitted on a yearly basis in a manner that retains compliance with statutory and constitutional obligations.

It is critical that video evidence of criminal acts, witness statements and suspect interviews be reviewed by Deputy District Attorneys during the processing of a criminal case. This type of evidence is currently not common in the majority of criminal cases prosecuted. With the implementation of body worn cameras, it is expected to be present in every criminal case.
