## **Welcome and Introductions**

<b>Military Helpline</b> Andrea Gardner <i>Lines for Life</i>	<ul> <li>Helpline provides immediate, confidential support to veterans and their families. Staff are highly trained and understand issues affecting military families as well as military culture. They conduct follow-ups if that is helpful to the individual. All eras are eligible.</li> <li>This past year they have experienced a 22% increase in calls. During discussion about trends they have observed, Andrea noted that Vietnam veterans report feeling like they are being closed out of services (especially long-term therapy), many callers report a need for face-to-face interaction when they schedule appointments rather than just medication management, and there seems to be a growing need for pro-bono family legal representation –especially in the area of custody cases. A common statement by families is that they "just want the veteran to be the way they used to be." The OEF/OIF program at the VA is very valuable for younger veterans and the lack of a similar program for Vietnam veterans is a gap that needs to be addressed.</li> <li>Next steps: <ul> <li>Lines for Life conducting outreach at events and in the community to better connect with veterans.</li> <li>County Veteran Service Officers have and will continue to try to connect with veteran who aren't getting the face-to-face contact they want at the VA and assist them to access other services that may be helpful.</li> <li>Discussion will continue about preparing soldiers and families early on rather than "therapeutic band-aids" during or following a crisis.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
