- Maintains Existing Programs
- Increases Victim Assistance (+2.00 FTE)
- Expands Neighborhood DA Program (+1.00 FTE)
- Funds Post-Conviction DDA Program (+1.00 FTE)
- Small General Fund FTE change (-0.40)
  - Increase in Direct Service FTE (+3.76 FTE)
  - Decrease in Support Staff (-3.40 FTE)
- Grant Funded FTE increase
  - Title IV-e (+4.50 FTE)
  - HB 3194 Program Staff (+2.30 FTE)

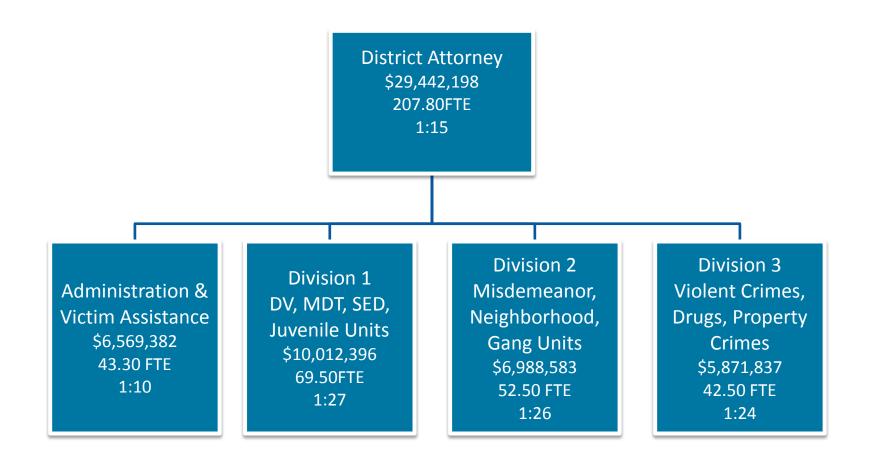

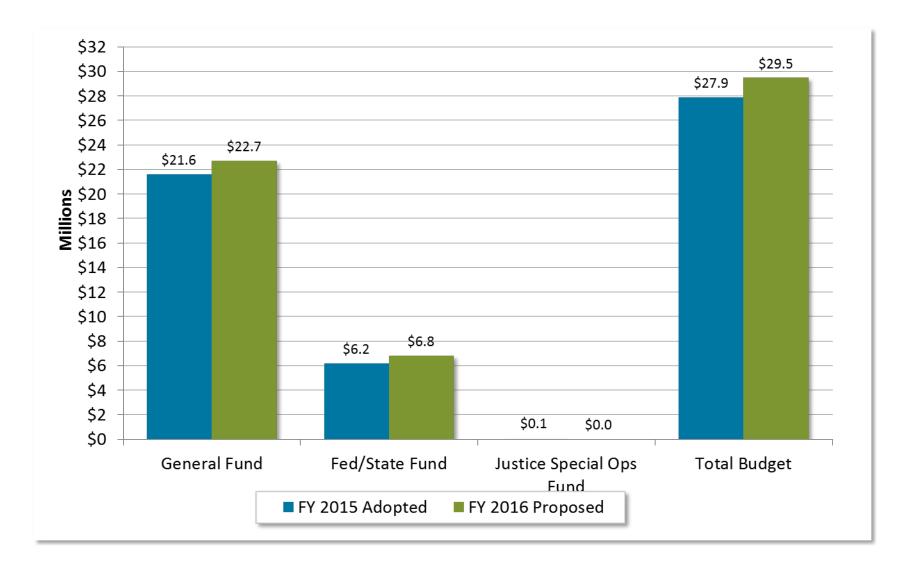
#### Organizational Chart







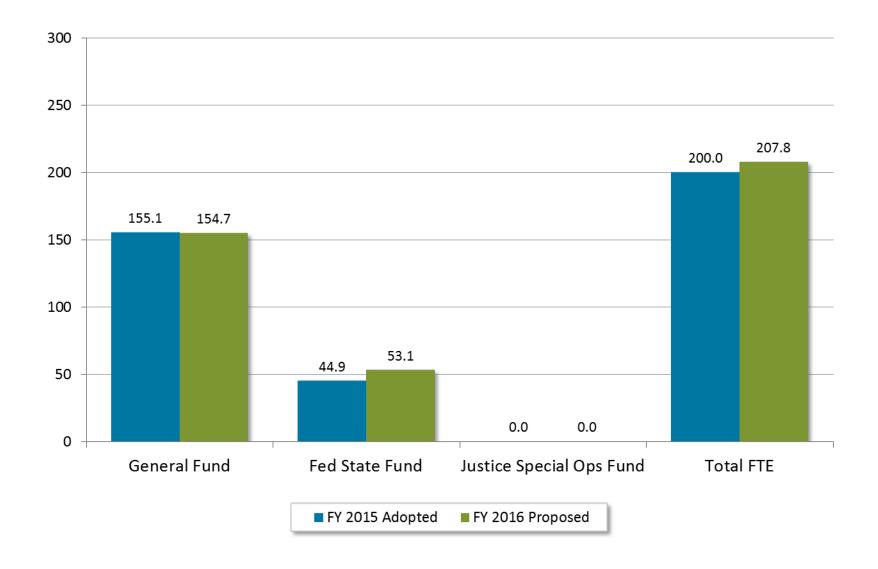
# Budget by Fund (Expenditures)







# FTE by Fund

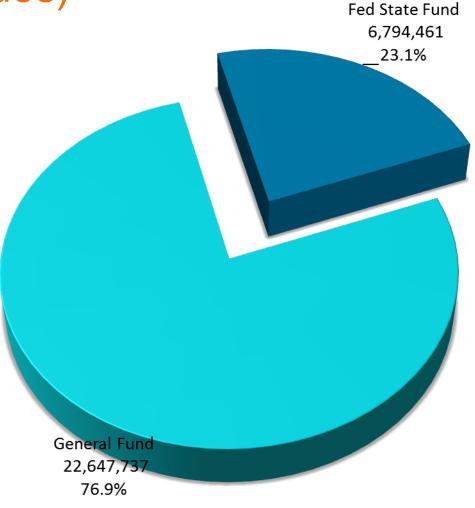






# Budget by Funding Source - \$29,442,198

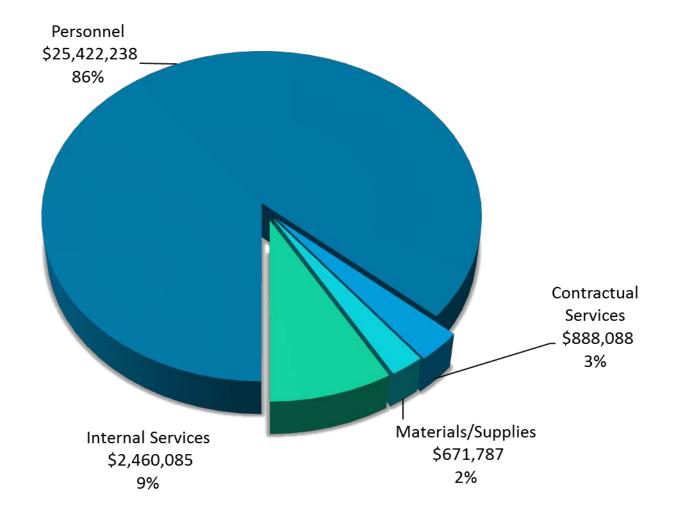

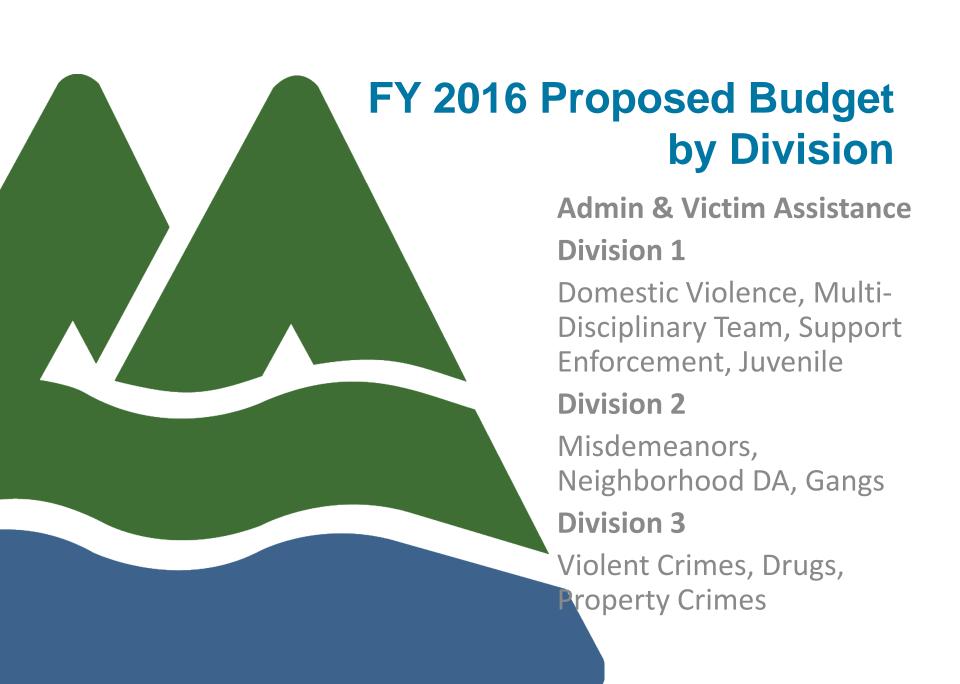




# Budget by Category - \$29,442,198

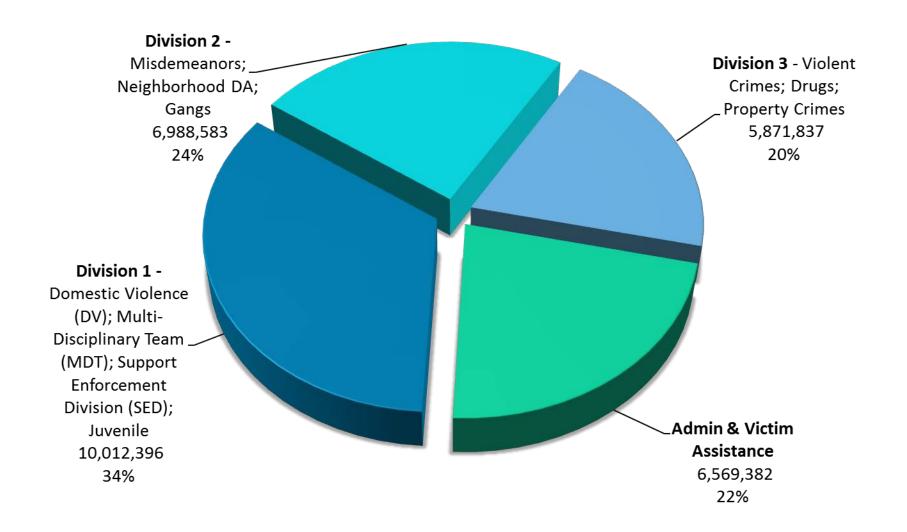






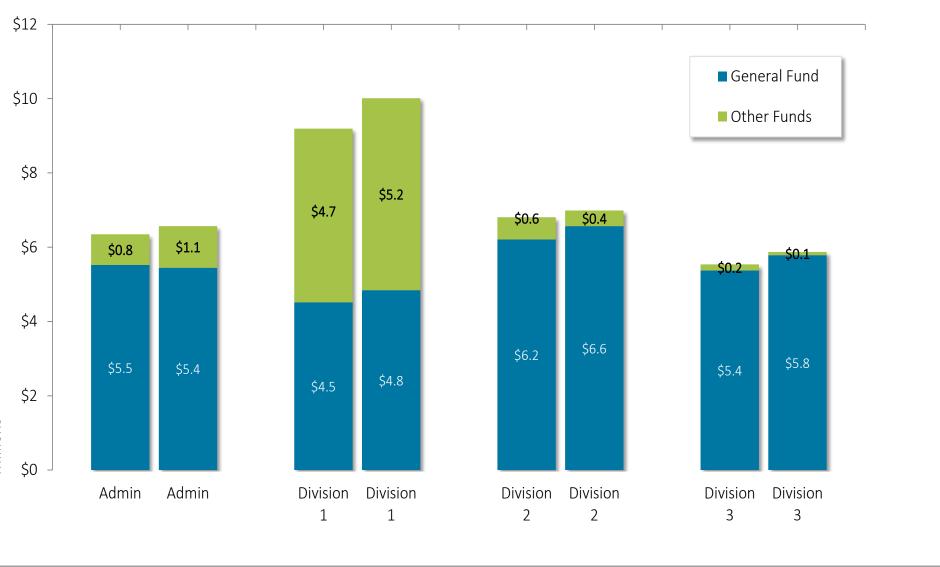


#### **Budget by Division**





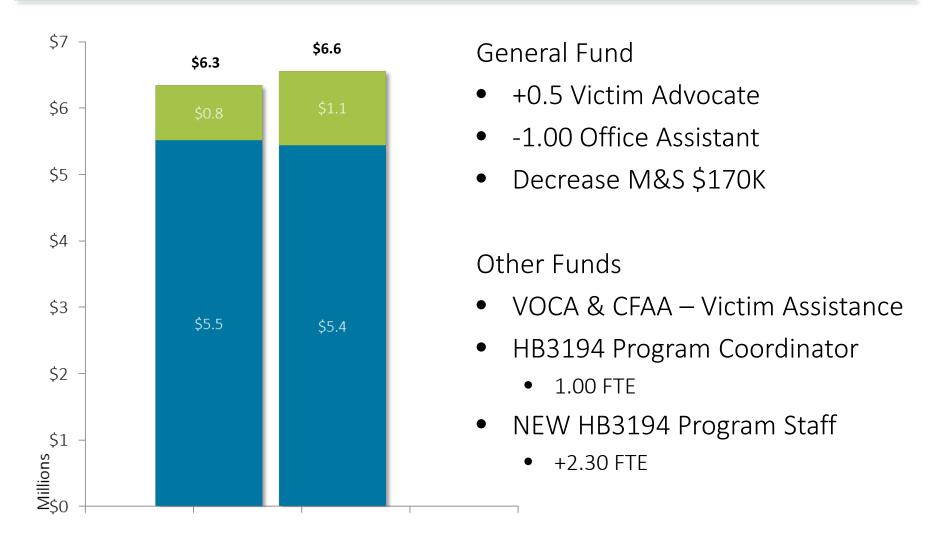
# Year over Year Division by Fund







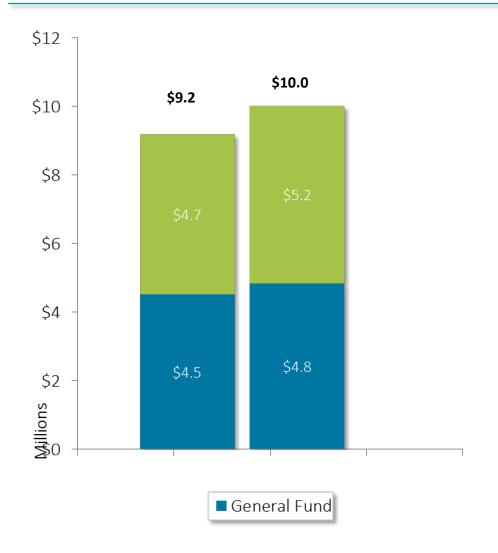

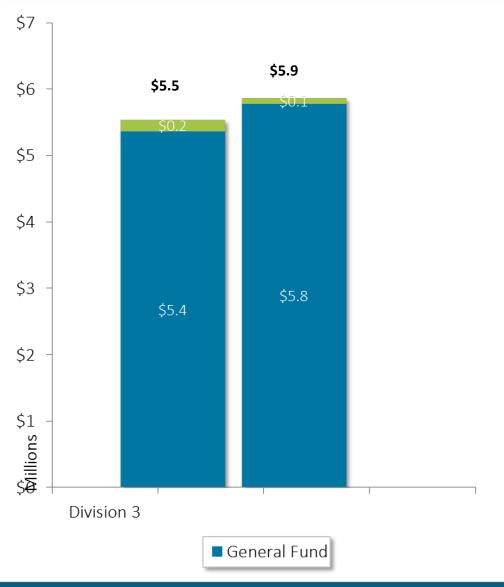

- Programmatic Changes
  - PO 15011 DA Program Staff (2.30 FTE)
    - Add Victim Advocate (1.00 FTE)
    - Add DDA 2 (0.50 FTE)
    - Add Research & Evaluation Analyst (0.3 FTE)
    - Add Legal Assistant 2 (0.50 FTE)
- Populations Served
  - Better informed decision making throughout the criminal justice system in addition to increased community success for previously prison-bound individuals
- Issues and Risks
  - State funding could be reduced in Legislative Budget
